



Dominican Republic

We led a team to the Dominican Republic from April 7th – 14th, 2019, immersing ourselves in the Dominican culture and history. We built two Habitat homes, serving in two areas: Haina and Los Alcarrizos. According to the International Housing Institute, the housing deficit in the Dominican Republic is estimated at over 1,000,000 units.












2019 Major Program Impact








